

Thank you to everyone who has registered their animals for our Lamb and Calf Day.




Those of you with calves will need to use this number 12665358 to transfer your calf TO & **FROM** (this is the key) the event. Please make sure this is done!

### SUMMER HOCKEY

Registrations are open for summer hockey held at the turfs in Palmerston North in term 4.

Year 1&2 play 4-aside on 1/6 turf, Year 3&4, 5&6 and 7&8 teams play 6-aside on 1/3 turf, all 25 minute games.
