Enviro Opportunities...

We were happy to be awarded a grant from the Pat Kelly Enviro Action Fund recently which will be used to create a chicken coop at school. Our Green Team decided that having chickens was our number one priority from our Enviro Vision. Our tamariki are keen for them to help deal with some of our food waste, and to use their eggs with the fruit and veges we grow at school to make yummy kai.

The construction of this coop will be part of a working bee that we hope you can join us for in the last weekend of the holidays - Saturday 12 October from 1-3pm. We have a variety of jobs - some of the usuals: cleaning out guttering, weeding etc, but would also a few bigger jobs like putting the shade sail poles in around the sandpit, re-securing the maypole etc. Bring along tools and equipment to help with these tasks and talk to Kieran Finnigan or Nigel Will if you have any questions.

We have also been invited to be involved with Trees for Survival as one of 5 schools starting this up in our area. This project involves potting on native tree seedlings into planter bags, keeping an eye on them while they grow, and then planting them out the following winter. Trees for Survival provide all the materials including the plants and an irrigated shade house. This is another project that formed a part of our Enviro Vision, and so it will be great to kick start that in a supported way.

Rangitikei Tough Kid...

Earlier this term both of our senior classes - Māhuri and Rākau - participated in the Tough Kid in Ohingaiti. This is a fun day out with lots of wins and challenges, depending on the individual, but three of our students earned really great placings. Awesome mahi Lily Pedley and Ruby Holtslag who both came 3rd in their events, Colton Whibley who placed 2nd, and ka rawe, Ben Stanbra, who won the Year 4 boys race.
