Enviro Action Day...

Next week, on Friday, we have our inaugural Enviro Action Day which was inspired by the Green Team's visit to Manchester Street School late last year. The whole school will spend the whole day involved in Enviro Action around our school, culminating in an

Enviro Hui-ā-kura at 2.15pm which you are all welcome to join us for.

This day will also see us launch our Enviro Rōpū or groups! These are 11 groups of about 7 students who will work together to design, lead and manage projects based on the action learning cycle, with the support of a kaumātua-adult. Each group has their own area of responsibility The aim is to add layers to and grow the leadership that began with just our Green Team in 2024.

We plan for the groups to have half an hour on a regular fortnightly basis to go about their mahi, along with an Enviro Action Day each term. We would be keen for a few more parent helpers, to support these teams - mostly to fill in if another adult is unavailable. Our tamariki are pretty excited to kick this off!

Congratulations to all our student from 7 years of age and up who participated in the triathlon at Sanson last Fridau, which started with slippery conditions.


